## State Government Sponsored Programmes with Bank Credit

- Chief Minister's *Krishi Rinn Yojana*: In order to provide facility of zero interest crop loan to the farmers of the state and to enable them towards easy access to formal credit through banking channels GoAP has continued CM's Krishi Rinn Yojana, which was launched last year. By this scheme GoAP would provide interest subvention of 4% on crop loan/ KCC limit upto R. 3.00 lakh sanctioned by banks to the farmers. The farmers would also get additional 3% interest subvention on prompt repayment of their crop loan within one year of disbursement of loan. The scheme would cover 2000 farmers across the state with a corpus of Rs.10 crore during the year.
- Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Bunkar Yojana: The scheme was launched last year and this year too the scheme has been continued with an objective to encourage the women weavers to access affordable credit from banks for their working capital requirements for loans upto Rs. 2.00 lakh, GoAP would provide interest subvention of 5% on the loan amount. The Govt has allocated Rs. 5 crore for implementation of this scheme to cover 500 weavers.
- Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Swavalamban Yojana: In order to encourage the unemployed youth to gain access to low cost capital for entrepreneurship, GoAP would provide 30% back ended capital investment subsidy for loan from Rs. 10.00 lakh to Rs. 1.00 crore. Under the scheme women entrepreneurs would get additional benefit of 5% interest subvention on loan amount. Activities covered interalia include value addition in agri & allied sector, tourism development, traditional textile weaving & manufacturing.
- CM's *Adarsh Gram Yojana*: The scheme was launched year and this year too the scheme has been continued with a corpus of Rs. 92 crore, GoAP has planned to identify 60 villages (@ one village per MLA constituency) within the state and develop them into Model village with all facilities of better health & sanitation.
- CM's District Innovation and Challenge Fund: With a corpus of Rs.100.00 crore, GoAP has initiated for development of districts. Fund allocation for each district varies from Rs.2.00 crore to Rs.10.00 crore.
- Cluster formation and Mission on Organic Value Chain Development (MOVCD): Developing POs/ Clusters for Agriculture/ Livestock/ Fisheries/ Handloom & Handicraft activities. Under this initiative, GoAP would identify ten districts with ten different commodities like Rice, Kiwi, Large Cardamom, Ginger, Soyabean, Turmeric, Pineapple, Arhar, Chilli and Mustard etc. for developing them into POs.

- Oil Palm Production: 20000 ha area to be covered in five years by 2020-21. Foot hill areas identified and plantation started through private Oil Palm developers as per MoU. The potential areas have been clustered into 4(four) zones as under:
- ZONE-I (5000 ha): Tirap, Changlang, Namsai, Lohit
- ZONE-II (5000ha): Lower Dibang Valley
- ZONE-III(5000ha): East Siang
- ZONE-IV (5000ha): West Siang, Lower Subansiri, Papumpare & East Kameng.
- Chief Minister's Agri -Employment Generation Programme: For providing transportation support for marketing of surplus agri-horti produce from rural areas to primary & secondary markets, 28 nos of Tata mobile (mini trucks) have been given to unemployed youths during 2016-17.
- State Apiculture Mission: For raising farmers' income and enhancement of Oilseeds productivity.
- Organic Mission: State Organic Mission launched on 15 April'2017:
- State Organic Mission initiated with State Policy on Organic Farming.
- Targeted certified organic area 2022: 1 lakh ha &2030 : 3 lakh ha
- Chief Minister's Agri-Mechanization Programme This programme was launched in 2012-13 to aid the farming community in purchase of costly farm machineries. Till date; 100 tractors, 300 power tillers, 700 pumping sets and 600 paddy de-husking machines have been distributed, benefiting 1700 farmers. This programme is continued in the current year and shall benefit more farmers.
- Integrated Dairy Development Project in Lohit District (Outlay Rs.5.00 Crore).
  - o To be established under CM's White Revolution Programme.
  - To create a value chain from milk aggregation to dairy processing with the help of AMUL under MoU with State Govt.
- National Livestock Mission (Outlay Rs.25.20 Crore)
  - (i) Milk processing Plant at Rupa in West Kameng District & Pasighat in East Siang District will be operationalized.
  - (ii) Milk Boilers at Seppa & Dibang Valley will be established to supply milk to these plants.
  - (iii) District Pig Breeding Farm at Ziro & Palin and a Livestock farm in Lower Subansiri District to be made operational.
  - (iv) Central Hatchery at Nirjuli to be commissioned this year
  - (v) District cattle breeding farm at Aalo to be started.

- Blue Revolution (Outlay Rs.6.00 Crore)
- To support 1000 fish farmers for construction of fishing ponds and for fish feed.
- Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY)
  - Construction of agricultural storage godowns at Lekang in Namsai District, Kalaktang in West Kameng District & at Koloriang in Kurung Kumey District have already started which will benefit 778 farmers.
  - Similar storage godowns will be constructed at Dumporijo, Jairampur & Aalo which would benefit more than 1000 farmers.
  - o Under Integrated Cooperative Development Project various infrastructure works have been taken up at a cost of Rs.3.82 crore to cover nearly 4000 beneficiaries.
- Dairy Entrepreneurship Development Programme (Outlay Rs.5.00 Crore)
- To provide 25% back ended capital subsidy to Entrepreneurs by the GoAP which will be over and above 33.33% subsidy provided by Central government.

- Three no's Bee Rearing Equipment production centers set up in Papumpare, East Siang and Changlang districts. 39 Unemployed youths have been benefitted through Integrated Farming system approach.

- Reforms of APMC Act as per model Act of GoI is being processed for accessing e-NAM
- Distribution of 10000 KCC & 40000 RuPay cards to JD A/c holders
- Establishment of Tea & Rubber Nurseries in Govt. Farms.
- Area expansion by land terracing for enhancement of Crop production
- Setting up of "State Level Agri Information Hub cum Farmers' Hostel" for effective information dissemination.
- One 500 MT capacity Cold Storage being set up at Emchi under Doimukh subdivision.
