## PRE-CONTRACT INTEGRITY PACT

National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) hereinafter referred to as “The Principal”

### **And**

### **Preamble**

The Principal intends to award, under laid down organizational procedures, contract/s for **“Tender for Repair of floor tiles & bathrooms in Staff Quarters in NABARD Gram Residential Complex, Channi Rama, Jammu- 180015**

The Principal values full compliance with all relevant laws of the land, rules, regulation, and economic use of resources and of fairness /transparency in its relations with its Bidder(s) and/or Contractor(s).

In order to achieve these goals, the Principal will appoint Independent External Monitors (IEMs) who will monitor the tender process and the execution of the contract for compliance with the principles mentioned above.

### **Section 1 – Commitments of the Principal**

(1) The Principal commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption and to observe the following principles: -

a. No employee of the Principal, personally or through family members, will in connection with the tender for, or the execution of a contract, demand, take a promise for or accept, for self or third person, any material or immaterial benefit which the person is not legally entitled to.

b. The Principal will, during the tender process treat all Bidder(s) with equity and reason. The Principal will, in particular, before and during the tender process, provide to all Bidder(s) the same information and will not provide to any Bidder(s) confidential / additional information through which the Bidder(s) could obtain an advantage in relation to the tender process or the contract execution.

c. The Principal will exclude from the process all known prejudiced persons.

(2) If the Principal obtains information on the conduct of any of its employees which is a criminal offence under the IPC/PC Act, or if there be a substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform the Chief Vigilance Officer and in addition can initiate disciplinary actions.

## Section 2 – Commitments of the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s)

(1) The Bidder(s) / Contractor(s) commits themselves to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption. The Bidder(s) / Contractor(s) commits themselves to observe the following principles during participation in the tender process and during the contract execution: Notice Inviting “**Replacement of tiles on floor and walls of toilets and bath rooms and other improvements in toilets and bathrooms etc. in Staff Quarters in NABARD Gram Residential Complex, Channi Rama, Jammu-180015.**”

a. The Bidder(s) / Contractor(s) will not, directly or through any other person or firm, offer, promise or give to any of the Principal’s employees involved in the tender process or the execution of the contract or to any third person any material or other benefit which he/she is not legally entitled to, in order to obtain in exchange any advantage of any kind whatsoever during the tender process or during the execution of the contract.

b. The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will not enter with other Bidders into any undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal. This applies in particular to prices, specifications, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelisation in the bidding process.

c. The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will not commit any offence under the relevant IPC/PC Act; further the Bidder(s) / Contractor(s) will not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain, or pass on to others, any information or document provided by the Principal as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained or transmitted electronically.

d. The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) of foreign origin shall disclose the name and address of the Agents/representatives in India, if any. Similarly, the Bidder(s)/Contractors(s) of Indian Nationality shall furnish the name and address of the foreign principals, if any.

e. The Bidder(s) /Contractor(s) will, when presenting their bid, disclose any and all payments made, is committed to or intends to make to agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the award of the contract.

f. Bidder(s) /Contractor(s) who have signed the Integrity Pact shall not approach the Courts while representing the matter to IEMs and shall wait for their decision in the matter.

(2) The Bidder(s) /Contractor(s) will not instigate third persons to commit offences outlined above or be an accessory to such offences.

## Section 3 – Disqualification from tender process and exclusion from future contracts

If the Bidder(s) /Contractor(s), before award or during execution has committed a transgression through a violation of Section 2, above or in any other form which put their reliability or credibility in question, the Principal is entitled to disqualify the Bidder(s) /Contractor(s) from the tender process.

## Section 4 – Compensation for Damages

(1) If the Principal has disqualified the Bidder(s) from the tender process prior to the award according to Section 3, the Principal is entitled to demand and recover the damages equivalent to Earnest Money Deposit/Bid Security.

(2) If the Principal has terminated the contract according to Section 3, or if the Principal is entitled to terminate the contract according to Section 3, the Principal shall be entitled to

demand and recover from the Contractor liquidated damages of the Contract value or the amount equivalent to Performance Bank Guarantee.

### **Section 5 – Previous transgression**

(1) The Bidder declares that no previous transgressions occurred in the last three years with any other Company in any country conforming to the anti-corruption approach or with any Public Sector Enterprise in India that could justify his exclusion from the tender process. Notice Inviting “**Tender for Replacement of tiles on floor and walls of toilets and bath rooms and other improvements in toilets and bathrooms etc. in Staff Quarters in NABARD Gram Residential Complex, Channi Rama, Jammu-180015**”

(2) If the Bidder makes incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from the tender process.

### **Section 6 – Equal treatment of all Bidders / Contractors/ Subcontractors**

(1) In case of Sub-contracting, the Principal Contractor shall take the responsibility of the adoption of Integrity Pact by the Sub-contractor.

(2) The Principal will enter into agreements with identical conditions as this one with all Bidders and Contractors

(3) The Principal will disqualify from the tender process all bidders who do not sign the Pact or violate its provisions.

### **Section 7 – Criminal charges against violating Bidders(s) / Contractor(s)/ Subcontractor(s)**

If the Principal obtains knowledge of conduct of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor, or of an employee or a representative or an associate of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractor which constitutes corruption, or if the Principal has substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform the same to the Chief Vigilance Officer.

### **Section 8 – Independent External Monitor**

(1) The Principal appoints competent and credible Independent External Monitor for this Pact after approval by the Central Vigilance Commission. The task of the Monitor is to review independently and objectively, whether and to what extent the parties comply with the obligations under this agreement. The Independent External Monitor appointed for NABARD is: Note: The Name & address of the Independent External Monitor (IEM) for J&K RO is Dr. Sanjay Kumar Panda, IAS (Retd) 515, Ward No.3, Sideshwar Sahi Cuttack City, Cuttack district, Odisha 753008 Email Id: sanjaypandaias@gmail.com Mobile: 8527661800

(2) The Monitor is not subject to instructions by the representatives of the parties and performs his/her functions neutrally and independently. The Monitor would have access to all Contract documents, whenever required. It will be obligatory for him / her to treat the information and documents of the Bidders /Contractors as confidential. He / she reports to the Chairman, NABARD.

(3) The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) accepts that the Monitor has the right to access without restriction to all Project documentation of the Principal including that provided by the Contractor. The Contractor will also grant the Monitor, upon his/her request and



demonstration of a valid interest, unrestricted and unconditional access to their project documentation. The same is applicable to Sub-contractors.

(4) The monitor is under contractual obligation to treat the information and documents of the Bidder(s) /Contractor(s) / Sub-contractor(s) with confidentiality. The Monitor has also signed declarations on 'Non-disclosure of Confidential Information and of 'Absence of Conflict of Interest'. In case of any conflict of interest arising at a later date, the IEM shall inform Chairman, NABARD and recuse himself/herself from that case. Notice Inviting **"Tender for Repair of floor tiles & bathrooms in NABARD Gram Residential Complex, Channi Rama, Jammu- 180015."**

(5) The Principal will provide to the Monitor sufficient information about all meetings among the parties related to the Project, provided such meetings could have an impact on the contractual relations between the Principal and the Contractor. The parties offer to the Monitor the option to participate in such meetings.

(6) As soon as the Monitor notices, or believes to notice, a violation of this agreement, he/she will so inform the Principal and request the CPP Portal to discontinue or take corrective action, or to take other relevant action. The monitor can in this regard submit non-binding recommendations. Beyond this, the Monitor has no right to demand from the parties that they act in a specific manner, refrain from action or tolerate action.

(7) The monitor will submit a written report to the Chairman, NABARD within 8 to 10 weeks from the date of reference or intimation to him by the Principal and, should the occasion arise, submit proposal for correcting problematic situations.

(8) If the Monitor has reported to the Chairman, NABARD, a substantiated suspicion of an offence under the relevant IPC/PC Act, and the Chairman NABARD has not, within reasonable time, taken visible action to proceed against such offence or reported it to the Chief Vigilance Officer, the Monitor may also transmit this information directly to the Central Vigilance Commissioner.

(9) The word 'Monitor' would include both singular and plural.

### **Section 9 – Pact Duration**

This Pact begins when both parties have legally signed it. It expires for the Contractor 12 months after the last payment under the contract, and for all other Bidders 6 months after the contract has been awarded. Any violation of the same would entail disqualification of the bidders and exclusion from future business dealings. If any claim is made/lodged during this time, the same shall be binding and continue to be valid despite the lapse of this pact as specified above, unless it is discharge/determined by the Chairman of NABARD.

### **Section 10 – Other provisions**

(1) This agreement is subject of Indian Law, Place of performance and jurisdiction is the Head Office of the Principal, i.e. Mumbai.

(2) Changes and supplements as well as termination notices need to be made in writing. Side agreements have not been made.

(3) If the Contractor is a partnership or a consortium, this agreement must be signed by all partners or consortium members.



(4) Should one or several provisions of this agreement turn out to be invalid, the remainder of this agreement remains valid. In this case, the parties will strive to come to an agreement to their original intentions.

(5) Issues like Warranty/Guarantee etc. shall be outside the purview of IEMs.

(6) In the event of any contradiction between the Integrity Pact and its Annexure, if any, the Clause in the Integrity Pact will prevail.

**INSTRUCTIONS TO THE BIDDERS FOR FURNISHING INFORMATION AS A PART OF PRE-TENDER QUALIFICATIONS ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA**

1. The work involved is **“Tender for Repair of floor tiles & bathrooms in NABARD Gram Residential Complex, Channi Rama, Jammu- 180015**
2. Scope of work and services/repairs to be provided are indicated in the **“SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS – Scope of Work (Part A)” and “Scope of work (Part B) – Illustrative”** of this tender. *The Bidders are advised to visit all the sites, conduct survey of the existing arrangements to familiarize themselves with the nature of works to be carried out and get all clarifications as necessary from NABARD before quoting their rates.*

3. The contractors should have experience of similar works during the last **7 years** (ending 31.03.2024) and who fulfil the following criteria are eligible to tender: -

The proof of experience: IT return for the year (2016-17) or earlier **or** work order for the period of financial year 2016-17 or earlier will be taken as proof of existence of firm.

- a) Should have carried out **minimum 1 similar work** with Govt./PSUs during last 5 years (ending 31.03.2024) with contract value (costing individually) not less than **₹23 lakhs.**

OR

- b) Should have carried out **minimum 2 similar works** with Govt./PSUs during last 5 years (ending 31.03.2024) with contract value (costing individually) not less than **₹14 lakhs.**

OR

- c) Should have carried out **minimum 3 similar works** with Govt./PSUs during last 5 years (ending 31.03.2024) with annual contract value (costing individually) not less than **₹11 lakhs.**

- d) The Bidders should have average **Annual Turnover** of **15 lakhs** each year during the **last three years** ending 31 March 2024 supported by audited balance sheet or a registered Chartered Accountant certified statement of accounts.

- e) The Bidders should have applicable registrations (PAN, TIN, TAN, GST, ESI, EPF, etc.) supported with documentary evidence and licenses, permissions, approvals issued by appropriate authorities such as Labour enforcement and other statutory authorities, wherever applicable and furnish copies of the same with tender (with the Pre-Qualifying Bid). Agency should have a valid license/registration as per GOI instructions or from any other competent authority to operate a manpower agency in the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir and similarly registration with appropriate competent authority. Bidders to note that copies of licenses and registration are to be submitted with the Pre- Qualifying bid i.e. Part I. Tenders

without required documents will be summarily rejected.

- f) Quoted rates should be workable, reasonable and should include all applicable taxes, incidental and all overheads and profits. The Tenderer will furnish Rate Analysis for scrutiny of the rates by NABARD, if required.
- g) **Bidders may be from PAN India but should have a branch office in J&K and should have works under execution in J&K.** Bidders are requested to submit the following documents in **PART - I** (Technical bid) for examining their qualification/suitability. Opening of **PART - II** (Financial Bid) will be subject to satisfying the prescribed eligibility criteria: -
- Copies of Work Orders and Satisfactory Service/work Certificates from clients for executing similar works for Central/State Government offices/Public Sector Undertakings/Public Sector Banks/Autonomous Bodies, etc. **during the last seven years.** “Similar Works” means experience in executing structural repair works in similar Government / PSUs / Public Sector Banks / Autonomous Bodies, etc. **having registered office or such similar setup in India.**
  - IT returns of last three consecutive financial years – 2021-22, 2022-23 & 2023-24.
  - References of clients / particulars of bankers, specifying their names and contact numbers (landline and mobile) and names of the contact executives / officials.
4. Intending Bidders are required to submit their full bio-data giving details about their organisation, experience, personnel in their organisation, spare capacity, competence and adequate evidence of their financial standing, etc. in the enclosed statement which will be kept confidential.
5. The Contractor should arrange to obtain necessary insurance cover i.e. (i) Workmen Compensation policy and (ii) **Contractors All Risk Policy (CAR policy) for his Labour/employees** at his cost and should be responsible for the safety of persons employed by him. The original Insurance Policy should be submitted to NABARD immediately after award of work. The CAR policies are required to be at least for 1.25 times of the contract value.
6. While deciding upon the selection of contractors, emphasis will be laid on the ability and competence of Bidders to undertake quality works within the specified time schedule and in close co-ordination with other agencies, besides the rate structure of the items.
7. If required, the Bank will obtain reports on past performance of the Bidder from his clients and bankers and evaluate the said reports before opening of the PART-II (Financial Bid) of the tenders. If any Bidder is not found to possess the required eligibility for participating in the tendering process at any point of time and/or his performance reports received from his clients and/or his bankers are found not satisfactory, the Bank reserves the right to reject his offer even after qualifying the

PART-I (Technical Qualification Bid) of the tender and PART-II of the tender will be rejected. The Bank is not bound to assign any reason for rejecting the tender.

8. After scrutiny of Part-I (Technical Qualification Bid), if any of the Bidders is found not satisfying the required eligibility criteria, the tender submitted by him will not be processed further and will be rejected.
9. Applications containing false and/or inadequate information are liable for rejection.
10. While filling up the application with regard to the list of important projects completed or on hand, the applicants shall only include those works which individually cost not less than the specified amount.

1. All the pages of the Tender Document shall be signed by the Bidder.
2. NABARD takes no responsibility for delay / loss in non-receipt of Tender Documents.
3. Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) amount of **₹56000/- (Rupees Fifty-Six Thousand Only)**, is to be remitted online to NABARD in the below account and the same will be reimbursed to the unsuccessful bidders by NABARD within 30 days of declaration of result of first stage, i.e. technical evaluation. MSME vendors are exempted from payment of EMD. **The online payment proof must be uploaded in CPP Portal.**

4. **“Performance Security/Initial Security Deposit” (ISD) of 2% of accepted value of the tender** (annual charges) shall be directly credited to our current account (details given above) by the successful Bidder within 15 days of intimation to him of acceptance of tender. The security will be liable to be forfeited in case the contractor commits any breach of any terms and conditions of the Contract or fails to complete the work. This forfeiture is independent of the liquidated damages provided for in the Contract.
5. Performance Security/ISD shall remain valid for a period of **sixty days** beyond the date of completion of all contractual obligations of the successful bidder, including warranty obligations. However, the Security is liable to be forfeited in case the vendor/contractor commits breach of any of the terms and conditions of the contract or fails to complete the work or deliver the goods/services. No interest will be paid on the performance security amount.
6. **EMD shall be refunded to the successful bidder on receipt of Performance Security in full.** In case the vendor desires the bid security/EMD to be adjusted against the Performance Security, the Performance Security or Bank Guarantee for the balance amount shall be obtained.
7. **Retention Money at the rate of 5%** shall be recovered from each on-account bill till the total recovery amounts to the figure stipulated in the tender document at the time of invitation of tender. This sum is arrived at after adjusting the amount of EMD/ISD. The EMD/ISD together with RMD will constitute Security Deposit. While determining the RMD, the EMD/ISD already with the Bank shall be taken into account.

8. The Tender / Quotation shall be submitted as per procedure of CPP Portal as PART-I (Pre- qualification Bid) and PART-II (Financial Bid) as the case may be, should be submitted in the CPP Portal.

9. Bids submitted by unauthorized agents and FAX / Posts shall not be entertained.

10. Bidders are advised to visit the site at their cost, conduct survey of existing conditions so as to familiarize themselves with the site conditions, nature of works etc. and get all clarifications as necessary from NABARD before quoting the rates.

11. If last date of receipt of Tender / Quotation and opening date is a holiday, then submission and opening of Tenders / Quotations shall be shifted to next working day without any change of time and venue.

12. The Bidders should quote their rates strictly adhering to Terms and Conditions stipulated in the Tender Document. Unsolicited correspondence after opening of the Tender shall not be entertained. Conditional / Deviational Tenders may be rejected without making any reference to the Bidders.

**13. No Bidder will be allowed to withdraw his Tender during the validity period. Subletting of the Contract is not permitted. In case any Bidder withdraws his/her tender during the validity period or is subsequently found to have sublet the same, the EMD amount received from such Bidders shall be forfeited.**

14. Rates should be filled in the Tender neatly and as far as possible, no correction shall be made. The rates quoted should be written legibly in words and figures. If on check, differences are observed between the rates given by the Contractor in words and figures or in the amount worked out by him, in such case the amount given in words will be considered final.

**15. Quantity and design change/deviation shall be at the sole discretion of NABARD.**

**16. Any extra work shall be done at the rate discovered in the tendering process.**

17. Notwithstanding anything stated above, NABARD reserves the right to assess the Bidders capability and capacity to perform the contract, should the circumstances warrant such assessment in the overall interest of NABARD.

**GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO THE CONTRACTORS**  
**AND GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT**

1. Bidders are advised to visit the site and thoroughly understand the nature and scope of the works and be familiar with the site conditions before quoting. The Tender is strictly on Item Rate basis.
2. All the pages of the Tender Document shall be signed by the Tenderer.
3. NABARD takes no responsibility for delay / loss in post or non-receipt of Tender Documents.
4. Tenders submitted by unauthorized agents and FAX / Telex / Telegraphic bids shall not be entertained / considered.
5. Rates quoted should be workable and reasonable and should include the following
  - a) The quantities indicated in the Bill of Quantities (BOQ) are only tentative and shall be executed only at the sole discretion of NABARD. There could be a variation of quantities within the limits prescribed by extant General Finance Rules of Ministry of Finance.
  - b) Incidental and all overheads and profits.
  - c) Item rate quoted should be inclusive of service charge/contractors' profit and taxes. Under any circumstances, no price escalation whatsoever shall be entertained during the contract period except revision in taxes.
  - d) Cost of Tools and Machinery
  - e) The contractor would be required to furnish rate analysis for scrutiny when called for, by NABARD.
6. Payment will be made only after completion of the works and based on bill submitted by the contractor and certified by the Bank Officer and Consultant for the work to the effect that the services are provided or work executed as per the contract agreement. The contractor can claim **intermittent bill for a minimum of 10.00 lakh** after completion of the specific item of work. The Contractor must get the Signature of the officer in-charge of the site after completion of respective work and should submit all these with the bill.
7. **The period of completion of work shall be 90 days from the date of acceptance of the contract by the successful bidder.**
8. Materials used should conform to relevant National/ International Codes and samples of materials should be made available to NABARD for technical examination and testing if required.
9. GST-TDS, Income Tax, Goods and Service Tax and other taxes as applicable, will be deducted from total payment due to the Contractors.

10. Specifications and Method of Measurements shall be followed as applicable. However, in the absence of the same and / or in case of any discrepancy, the decision of NABARD will be final.
11. NABARD will not be under any liability to pay any compensation to the persons deployed by the contractor if they sustain any injury etc., while discharging the duties in the said premises. The contractor shall get them insured against any liability or any accident at its own cost. The Contractor should arrange to obtain necessary insurance cover for his employees at his cost and should be responsible for the safety of persons employed by him. The Contractor shall be fully responsible and shall compensate NABARD in the event of any damage to person or material, injury /damage or death as the case may be, caused directly or indirectly due to the negligence of the Contractor or his agents and / or his employees or workforce.
12. The Contractor or his authorized representative should visit the site regularly and if necessary, meet NABARD's Officer with prior appointment for any clarifications and to receive instructions, take measurements, etc. at the site. A measurement book to be maintained at site & the bill will be cleared based on the entries of the same. A site register will also be maintained recording the progress of the work.
13. Any damages caused to the building / premises during the execution of the work shall be made good by the Contractor and if necessary, through suitable Insurance cover at his cost.
- 14. The contractor shall deploy such minimum number of qualified and experienced labour/workmen as required for completing the work within the stipulated deadline to ensure that the work is attended in time as per the scope of work of the tender, to the satisfaction of NABARD.**
15. All the Standard Conditions of the Contract shall be binding on the parties as per Indian Contract Act and other prevailing Rules.
16. The contractor shall pay the personnel deployed in NABARD, their wages in accordance with the minimum Wages Act, 1948 on a monthly basis. The contractor shall also make PF contribution, ESI contribution and or any other statutory contribution in respect of the personnel deployed in NABARD. Tenders/bids not complying with the minimum wages payment will be rejected.
17. The contractor shall, for all intents and purposes, be the "Employer" within the meaning of different Labour Legislations in respect of skilled and unskilled personnel so employed and deployed in NABARD and the manpower so employed and deployed in NABARD shall remain under the overall control and supervision of the contractor. The persons deployed by the contractor in NABARD shall not have claims of Master and Servant relationship (implicitly or explicitly) between him/her/them and NABARD nor have any principal and agent relationship with or against the NABARD. The contractor's personnel shall not claim any benefit/ compensation/absorption

/regularization of services under the provision of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 or Contract Labour (Regulation & Abolition) Act, 1970 or any other act related thereto.

18. The Contractor shall comply with the provisions of Contract Labour (Regulation & Abolition) Act, 1970, Minimum Wages Act, 1948 and all other Labour Laws and other Statutory Regulations (both Central and State) that may be enforced from time to time by the appropriate authorities. NABARD shall not be responsible in any manner in the event of non-compliance with various labour laws in force by the contractor and the onus of compliance lies solely with the contractor. The contractor is advised to maintain attendance register of his staff employed at sites and wage register for payment (at least minimum wages as per Centre Govt.) with all records up to date as per the labour regulations. The contractor may be asked to submit the monthly payment records to the staff employed by him. The contractor is advised to ensure that the payment is regularly credited to the bank account of the individual staff employed within the time schedule of Labour laws and pay slips for respective payments are duly issued regularly.
19. The contractor should ensure payments to the employed personnel/ Labour as per latest Minimum Wages Act and payment of bonus in terms of Bonus Act, 1965.
20. The Contractor should be responsible to fulfil all the obligations in connection with the workers employed by the Contractor for the purpose of the Contract and all the Statutory and other liabilities, if any, including minimum wages, leave salary, uniform, ex-gratia, gratuity, ESI, Provident Fund, Workman Compensation, if any, etc. in connection therewith shall be on the Contractor's account and payable by the Contractor.
21. The Contractor should obtain necessary permission that may be required for the purpose of this Contract from such authorities as may be prescribed by Law from time to time.
22. The Contractor or his authorized representative should visit the site frequently as required by NABARD and meet Officials for any clarifications and to receive instructions.
23. The Contractor shall have whole/ sole responsibility for any damage / loss of life and property of NABARD on the part of any employee engaged by the Contractor resulting in any loss to NABARD or any of its clients. The contractor shall fully compensate NABARD for such damage/loss. The decision of NABARD in this regard shall be final and binding.
24. Any act of indiscipline / misconduct / theft / pilferage on the part of any employee engaged by the Contractor resulting in any loss to NABARD or any of its clients in kind or cash will be viewed seriously and NABARD will have the right to claim damages or

levy fine and / or terminate the Contract forthwith, if necessary without any notice.

25. In case of any default or failure on Contractor's part to comply with all / any one of the Terms / Conditions, NABARD reserves to itself the right to take necessary steps to remedy the situation including, inter-alia, the deduction of appropriate amount/s from dues otherwise payable to Contractor and / or by taking recourse to appropriate recovery proceedings.
26. If any dispute arises on any matter concerning this Contract, the decision of NABARD shall be final and binding.
27. The Contractor should not at any time do, cause or permit any nuisance on the site / do anything which shall cause unnecessary disturbances or inconvenience to the occupants / visitors at site or near the site of work.
28. The work should be carried out with least inconvenience to the staff members of NABARD. The workmen employed by the Contractor should abide by the Rules and Regulations maintained by NABARD in the premises, especially in respect of working hours, entry of the workers to the premises, wearing of uniforms, interpersonal relation with the staff. The contractor shall provide photo identity card and uniform to its workers including the leave reserves. Any workman not maintaining discipline / decorum inside the premises shall be immediately removed from site.
29. The Contractor should obtain approvals, if any, necessary for the work from the statutory bodies. The Contractor shall assist NABARD fully in respect of any liaison with the Municipal/Police or any other authority for necessary approval / permission with regard to the AMC works.
30. The Contractor shall provide documentary proof of police verification for each and every personnel deployed with NABARD and replacement, if any, shall also be brought into effect.
- 31. EXIT:**
  - i) If the services/work of the contractor are not found to be satisfactory, the contractor will be given a notice, with a notice period of 15 days, to improve his services/works. If the contractor fails to improve his services within the Notice period, NABARD shall have the discretion to terminate the contract either in part or in whole, any day after the expiry of the said notice period.
  - ii) The contract is liable for termination by giving one-month notice by the Bank and three months' notice by the contractor.
32. On-site storage space will be provided to the Contractor subject to availability. NABARD will not be responsible for Contractor's materials. The Contractor may be required to

vacate the storage space and sheds as per exigency after making good the area clean without any extra cost to NABARD.

33. The Contractor shall provide everything necessary for the proper execution of the works. NABARD will not supply any 'T & P' and materials or any other equipment, materials, labor, etc. and no payment in this respect will be made by NABARD.
34. NABARD will not be responsible for contractor's materials.
35. The contractor shall provide everything necessary for the proper execution of the works. Any defect which may appear within the Defect Liability Period after the Virtual completion of work should be rectified by the Contractor at his cost and risk and only thereafter the Security Deposit will be refunded to the Contractor. **Defects Liability period: 12 Months from the date of Virtual Completion of works certified by NABARD.**
36. The Contractor shall not directly or indirectly transfer, assign or sublet the Contract or any part of it, without written permission of NABARD.
37. No advance payment shall be made. Further, Contractor will not link payment to his manpower with the settlement of bills by NABARD.
38. **VALIDITY OF TENDER: 90 Days from the date of opening of the Tenders.**
39. If in the opinion of NABARD, the work done by the contractor is not satisfactory, NABARD may decide depending upon the merit of the work to deduct such amount from the bill amount as it may deem fit.
40. The contractor shall use necessary safety equipment and maintain all safety measures during the execution of works and ensure compliance of Safety Code as per rules and Regulations in force.
41. Contractor shall extend necessary help to other Contractors engaged by NABARD under separate contract for their respective work.
42. Contractor shall be required to furnish NABARD, as and when required, the following:
  - (i) The Power of Attorney, name and signature of his authorized representative, who will be in-charge of execution of this contract.
  - (ii) Registration certificate copies.
  - (iii) Validity of Insurance Policies, Labour Contract License relating to staff engaged at NABARD site. The Contractor shall take all precautions necessary and shall be responsible for safety of work and risk involved in works carried out by their personnel.
  - (iv) Contractor shall vouch safe bonafides, conduct and fidelity of the staff employed by him. Any damage caused willfully or in negligence to the works executed, shall be borne by him. The penalties mentioned in Service Level

Agreement (SLA) given in CPP Portal shall be applicable.

43. The contractor shall remove from work any worker who is found to be failing in his duties or whose presence in premises is otherwise objectionable in the opinion of NABARD.
44. The manpower deployed by the contractor for discharging the contractual obligations under the contract shall be the employees of the contractor. NABARD shall in no way be connected with such manpower and they shall have no claim whatever against NABARD.
45. The Contractor shall at his own cost and expenses provide all the materials, labour, supervision tools, plant apparatus, ladders, trolleys, conveyance, etc. required for execution of the work covered by this contract to the entire satisfaction of NABARD.
46. Notwithstanding anything contained therein the labourers, workmen, supervisors and other employed persons by the Contractor for the purpose of the works shall for all purposes be regarded as the Contractor's employees. Therefore, neither the contractor nor any of such employees shall have any right to complain or claim against NABARD. NABARD also shall have no concern with them and shall not be liable to make any payment to or any contribution on account of them.

1. Scope of Work: **Repair of floor tiles & bathrooms in NABARD Gram Residential Complex, Channi Rama, Jammu-180015**

2. Description:

**(I) DISMANTLING & DEMOLITION**

- a) Dismantling existing ceramic wall/floor tile with backing cement plaster Removal of all debris and disposal of all Malwa during execution job beyond municipal limits. While quoting the cost for dismantling, the rate disposing the waste to be applicable in urban dumping areas.
- b) Dismantling doors including chowkhats, architrave, holdfasts etc. of area of 3 sqm. and below complete and stacking within 50 meters lead.
- c) Dismantling 15 to 20 mm dia G.I. pipe including stacking of dismantled pipes (within 50 metres lead) as per direction of Engineer-in-Charge.
- d) Demolishing brick work manually/by mechanical means including stacking of serviceable material and disposal of unserviceable material beyond municipal limits as per direction of Engineer-in-charge In cement mortar.

**(II) FLOOR/ SKIRTING / WALL DADO FINISHES/DOORS/WINDOWS**

Providing and fixing white vitreous china pedestal for wash



basin completely recessed at the back for the reception of pipes and fittings.

Frame size 50 x 100 mm

- b) Providing and fixing factory made singly extruded WPC (Wood Polymer Composite) solid plain flush door shutter of required size comprising of virgin PVC polymer of K value 58-60 (suspension grade), calcium carbonate and natural fibre (wood powder/rice husk/wheat husk) and non-toxic additives (maximum toxicity index of 12 for 100 gm) having minimum density of 650 kg/cum and screw withdrawal strength of 1800 N (face) and 900 N (edge), minimum compressive strength of 50 N/mm<sup>2</sup>, modulus of elasticity 850 N/mm<sup>2</sup> and resistance to spread of flame of class A category with property of being termite proof, moisture/waterproof and fire retardant and fixing with stainless steel butt hinges of required size with necessary full body threaded star headed counter sunk SS screws, all as per direction of engineer-incharge  
30 mm thick

#### **(V) REPAIRS TO BUILDINGS**

- a) Repairs to plaster of thickness 12mm to 20 mm in patches of area 2.5 sq. meters and under, including cutting the patch in proper shape raking out

joints and preparing and plastering the surface of the walls complete including disposal of rubbish to the dumping ground outside municipal limits With cement mortar 1:4 (1 cement : 4 fine sand)

- b) Brick work with common burnt clay (non-modular) bricks of class designation 7.5 in superstructure up to floor v level including curing in : Cement mortar 1:6 ( 1 cement : 6 coarse sand)

### Annexure-I

**Specifications are indicative only and must confirm to relevant ISI specifications and industry standards)**

#### Civil Works

##### A. Bathroom and Water Closet Renovation:

- a) Providing and fixing white vitreous china pedestal type water closet (European type) with seat and lid , 10 liter low level white vitreous china flushing cistern and CP flush bend with fittings and C.I. brackets, 40mm flush bend, overflow arrangement with specials of standard make and mosquito proof coupling of approved municipal design complete, including painting of fittings and brackets, cutting and making good the walls and floors wherever required W.C. pan with ISI marked white solid plastic seat and lid.
- b) Providing SS Health Faucet with Stop cork of size 150 x 150mm including cost of teak wood plugs, brass screws, etc.
- c) Providing and fixing wash basin with C.I. brackets, 15 mm dia CP Brass single hole basin mixer of approved quality and make, including painting of fittings and brackets, cutting and making good the walls wherever required: - White Vitreous China Wash basin size 550x400 mm with a 15 mm CP Brass single hole basin mixer. Providing and fixing white vitreous china pedestal for wash basin completely recessed at the back for the reception of pipes and fittings.
- d) Providing and fixing 600x450 mm beveled edge mirror of superior glass (of approved quality) complete with 6 mm thick hard board ground fixed to wooden cleats with C.P. brass screws and washers complete.
- e) Providing and fixing PTMT towel rail complete with brackets fixed to wooden cleats with CP brass screws with concealed fitting arrangement of approved quality and colour: 450 mm long towel rail with total length of 495 mm, 78 mm wide and effective height of 88 mm, weighing not less than 170 gms.
- f) Dismantling existing doors, existing plumbing fittings, pipes, M S Jali, CI pipes, mirrors, towel rods, soap dispensers, all fixed furniture such as partitions, mirrors, sanitary fittings, CP fittings, concealed/open water supply / drainage plumbing pipes, etc. and refixing of new items. The rate shall include stacking of items such as door frames, shutters, electrical cables and fittings, etc.

### B. Tile Works over the finished Floor

- a) The tiling work shall be done as per the pattern directed by the Officer-in-Charge. As a general practice laying of tiles shall be commenced from the center of the area and advanced towards the walls. Cut tiles, if any, shall be laid along wall with necessary border pattern as shown / directed by the Officer-in-Charge.
- b) Tiling work shall be completed by pressing tiles firmly into place along the floor. A white cement slurry/ good quality tile affixing adhesive to the back of the tile to be applied to ensure proper and full bedding. The tiles shall be laid on the bedding mortar when it is still plastic but has become sufficiently stiff to offer a fairly firm cushion for the tiles. Tiles, which are fixed on the flooring adjoining the floor, shall be so arranged that the surface on the round edge tiles shall correspond to the skirting or dado.
- c) Press gently the tile with wooden mallet for even adherence at the back of the tile. Do not use an iron hammer or some heavy material to press the tile. The edges of the tiles shall be smeared with neat white cement slurry and fixed in this grout one after the other, each tile being well pressed and gently tapped with a wooden mallet till it is properly bedded and in level with the adjoining tiles.
- d) There shall be no hollows in bed or joints. The joints shall be kept as close as possible and in straight line. Unless otherwise specified, jointless tiling shall be done butting the tiles with each other. If joint is specified, the same shall not exceed 1.00 mm. in width. The joint shall be grouted with white / matching color cement slurry.

### C. PLUMBING WORK

Materials shall be of the best approved quality obtainable and unless otherwise specified they shall conform to the respective Indian Standard Specification.

- a. Samples of all materials shall be got approved before placing order and the approved samples shall be deposited with the Employer.
- b. In case of non-availability of materials in metric sizes, the nearest size in FPS units shall be provided with prior approval of the Owners/ Consultants for which neither extra will be paid nor shall any rebate be recovered.
- c. If directed, materials shall be tested in any approved testing laboratory and the contractor shall produce the test certificate. The entire charges for original as well as repeated tests shall be borne by the Contractor. If required by the Owners / Consultants, the Contractor shall arrange to test portion of work at his own cost in order to prove their soundness and efficiency. If, after any such test, the work or portion of work is found, in the opinion of the Employer/ Consultants, to be defective or unsound, the Contractor shall pulldown and re-do the same at his own cost. Defective material also shall be removed from the site.

d. Water pipe line And fitting materials:

1.4.1 Cold water pipe line use PVC pipe (Finolex Blue 3/4" dia/equivalent)

1.4.2 Hot water pipe line use CPVC pipe with specials Solvent-cement joints.

1.4.3 Hydro-static test 15 kg /cm<sup>2</sup> or twice the working pressure whichever is higher. Without drop in pressure as required. (Minimum Six hours)

e. Soil & waste pipe lines.

1.5.1 Soil and waste pipe line use 6kg class pipe with fittings.

1.5.2 Water Test & smoke test.

f. Cutting, Threading, Laying and Joining:

The pipes and fitting shall be inspected at site before use to ascertain that they conform to the specification given in para above. The defective pipes shall be rejected and removed from site.

g. Joining & Laying:

i) Screwed Joints:

Do not damage the fitting surface, remove burrs and ream smooth. Apply red lead oil to nail threads only. Clean joints thoroughly of excess joining materials.

ii) Flanged Joints: Use matched flange faces and 2 mm thick compressed asbestos gaskets /rubber gaskets.

iii) Exposed Threads on exposed finished piping at plumbing fixtures and equipment will not be accepted.

h. Internal work: Generally, the galvanized iron pipes and fittings shall run in the wall chase inside the toilets and kitchen but on the surface in the service ducts. For exposed pipes, the Clamps fixing shall be done by means of mild steel angle brackets and clamps, as shown in the drawings, keeping the pipes not more than 200 mm clear of the wall.

- When it is concealed, the pipe chasing may be adopted. For pipes fixed in the ducts or recesses etc., provide sufficient space to work on the pipes with the usual tools. The pipes shall not ordinarily be buried in solid floors.
- Where unavoidable pipes may be buried for short distances provided adequate protection is given against damage and shall be fixed at a place a pipe is passing through a wall or floor to allow freedom for expansion and contraction and other movements.
- In the case, the pipes is embedded in walls or floors it should be painted with anti-corrosive bitumastic of approved quality and pipe shall be wrapped in burlap or Hessian cloth impregnated with bitumen.

- The wrapping shall be made to fit tightly over the pipe and where wrapping with a new piece overlap the old pipe and where wrapping one joint it shall be tied with M.S wire or nylon thread. Where pipes are encased within chases made in the wall, they shall be fixed to the wall with M.S clamps so as to prevent movement before filling in and making good the chase.

i) CPVC Pipes and fittings:

If internal cold water piping inside the toilets is carried out with CPVC Pipes the same shall be threaded CPVC Pipes of “Finolex/ SUPREME/SUPREME aqua Gold/ASTRAL PVC’ or equivalent make manufactured as per ASTM-D- 1785 and threads as per IS:1239 (Part 1). The pipes shall be of following duty conditions.

a. 15 mm dia upto 40 mm dia - Schedule 80

b. 50 mm dia upto 150 mm dia. - Schedule 80

j) Tightening by hand only.

Support: All horizontal pipes should be supported at a distance of approximately 0.8 M and all vertical pipes shall be supported at a distance of 1.2 Mts. with appropriate clips which allow for movement of pipes during temperature change.

h) Threading:

While threading at site, square cut of pipe ends shall be ensured. The ends shall be chamfered with a file. Proper sized wooden plugs shall be inserted in the pipe end and then threading shall be carried out. The sharp edges of gripping vice and other handling tools should be muffed with a suitable packing to prevent damage of pipe surface. No metallic tools should be used preferably for joining.

When pipes are concealed in walls, the pipes should be pressure tested and shall be kept full water while other accessories are being installed. In case of accidental puncture, this will ensure immediate detection. Special care should be taken while connecting PVC Pipes and fittings with G.I.System. Either araldite joint or standard threaded injection moulded fittings should be used.

#### D. SANITARY FIXTURES AND FITTINGS

##### 1.0 Installation of Fixtures and Fittings:

- All Plumbing and Sanitary Fixtures and fittings should be 1st (Standard) quality and shall be stored in covered stores and handled carefully to prevent damage. The sanitary fittings shall be installed at the correct assigned positions as shown on the drawings and as directed by the Engineer-in-charge/ Consultants / Owners Representative at site and shall fully meet with the aesthetic and symmetrical requirements as demanded by the Architects/person incharge.
- Fixtures shall be installed by skilled workmen with appropriate tools according to the Standard practice in the trade. Manufacturer’s instructions shall be followed for the installation of the fixtures.

- The outlet of water closet pans and similar appliances shall be examined to ensure that outlet ends are abutting properly on the receiving pipes before making the joints. It shall be ensured that the receiving pipes are clear of obstruction.
- When fixtures are being mounted, attention shall be paid to the possibility of movement / settlement by other causes. A check shall be made to ensure that necessary anchoring devices have been provided for supporting water closets, lavatory basin sinks, flushing cisterns and other appliances.
- Where the built-in types of brackets are used, they shall be securely fixed to the walls and slabs by approved means. It shall be ensured that while fixing the fixtures and fittings, no tool marks or scratches are developed. All steel brackets and supports shall be painted.

## 2. Protection of Fixtures:

Care shall be taken at all times, particularly after fixing to protect fixtures from damage. All offsets shall be temporarily plugged during progress of work to prevent obstruction. Fixtures shall be finally cleaned to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in-charge / Owners Representative at Site.

## E. Mode of Measurements

- All measurements unless otherwise mentioned shall be measured by area in sq. m. upto two places of decimal. Length and breadth shall be measured correct upto two places of decimal of a meter. Deduction will be made from the areas of fixtures grills, ventilation, outlets individually more than 0.05 sq. m. The item shall include removing nails, making good holes, cracks, patches etc. not exceeding 0.1 sqm each with materials similar in composition to the surface to be prepared.

## SAFETY CODE

1. There shall be maintained in a readily available place, First Aid appliance including adequate supply of sterilized dressings and cotton wool.
